Welcome back from what I hope was a wonderful break for everyone.

Staff Development Day

On Monday the staff of Jewells Primary gave careful consideration to the values that we will hold ourselves accountable for.


Staff worked carefully through a review of our roll marking and attendance monitoring procedures, with the aim to refine the manner in which we carefully track students, bolster and celebrate their daily attendance.

In addition to this, considered time was used to carefully examine and reflect on the Teaching and Learning Programs and Intervention support processes. Invaluable time was spent by grade/stage teams in planning and preparing learning sequences, as well as the support and enrichment frameworks that better assist us in meeting the needs of all students.

Intervention

The role of the interventionist teacher is to support and/or provide required enrichment/extension to identified students. The role of the interventionist teacher is to:

- Work closely with the classroom teachers and supervisor they are allocated to, to complete an Interventionist Profile for each student they will be working with
- Deliver precise support and/or enrichment in a specific area of identified need as determined by the classroom teacher(s)
- Model exemplary classroom practices when tailoring adjusted learning programs for students with additional learning needs
- Deliver tailored learning support for students in literacy and numeracy to support improved outcome achievement
- Regularly monitor and assess student learning and the implementation of targeted interventions to ensure a positive impact on learning outcomes for those identified students
- Meet with the Principal and other interventionist staff on a fortnightly basis, to provide evidence of planned support and to discuss the data being collected that validates the impact of the interventions being delivered
- Ensure timetable is equitable for all classes and discussed with Principal

SAFETY around schools



ROAD RULES IN SCHOOL ZONES:

Pedestrian crossings
You cannot stop within 20 metres before a pedestrian crossing or 10 metres after a pedestrian crossing unless there is a control sign permitting parking.
Maximum penalty: \$439 and two demerit points

Double parking
You may not stop on the road alongside to another vehicle at any time even to drop off or pick up passengers.
Maximum penalty: \$330 and two demerit points

Parking on a verge
You cannot stop or park on a verge area (footpath, nature strip, dividing strip or kerb).
Maximum penalty: \$183 and two demerit points

PARKING RESTRICTION SIGNS






You cannot stop here
Unless there is a medical or other emergency
Maximum penalty: \$330 and two demerit points

You cannot stop here
You are not allowed to stop your vehicle unless you are driving a bus.
Maximum penalty: \$330 and two demerit points

You can stop here for two minutes only
You have no more than two minutes to drop off or pick up passengers or goods and the driver must stay within three metres of the vehicle.
Maximum penalty: \$183 and two demerit points

You cannot stop here
Unless a current Mobility Parking Scheme (MPS) permit is displayed.
\$549 and one demerit point
