#### Principals' message

On Tuesday the school leadership team met with the Director Educational Leadership and representatives from the Leadership and High Performance Unit, to carefully examine the teaching, learning and leadership practices within the school. This was a very intensive inspection of the school vision, values, plan and operational practices. I am extremely pleased to inform the schooling community of the commendation received for the reform journey in progress since the beginning of this year.



An unintentional outcome from this has been my absence from school due to an invitation to work alongside the Leadership and High Performance Unit in supporting other schools through external validation processes, peer principal welfare support and state-wide principal development. The benefits to Jewells Primary School from my involvement are the increased links to learning alliances across the state, whereby our teachers will have access to a plethora of evidence informed and research based professional learning that will improve the quality of teaching and student learning across the school.

I would like to thank and congratulate the leadership team for their cohesive work in driving our planned initiatives and in assisting with the clear and focussed leadership of the school. I am cognisant of time out of the school though and have looked to strategically minimise this whilst still providing system support to colleagues across the state.



#### **Staffing Changes**

The school has had several staffing changes of recent as temporary teachers become successful in gaining employment; some staff have commenced maternity/paternity leave, and other staff have had to take leave due to illness. As you can appreciate, this can impact the quality and consistency of programs and initiatives that the school has operating. Such staffing complexities occur from time to time and require responsiveness as well as strategic consideration regarding the capacity to continue to run certain programs. The leadership team and I have endeavoured to employ quality casual teachers to replace, but when this cannot occur due to complexities in supply/demand, there may be times when classes have to be split. This is always the last resort, and unfortunately an unintentional outcome.

#### **Canteen News**

At the P&C meeting of 15 August, our canteen supervisor of the last 7 years, Fay Tzavellas, announced her resignation. This signals the end of an era for our canteen and Fay's massive contribution will be missed. At the end of the year, Sue Giles will also stop working at the canteen as her grandson moves into high school. Fay (who has done all the cooking and ordering for the



canteen) and Sue currently work on the canteen every Monday morning and every Friday morning – and they are the people in charge - so their departure will leave big gaps in our rosters.

We have also had a couple of our volunteers resign because of work commitments and for health reasons. However, some new volunteers have come on board, other volunteers are now returning following surgery, and the canteen has been able to remain open.

We will desperately need more volunteers for Mondays, so please consider whether you may be able to help. We always welcome more help for Wednesdays and Fridays as well (even in a reserve capacity). The shifts available are Mondays, Wednesdays or Fridays either morning (9 - 12.30) or recess (1.30 - 3) or a full day, and you can choose to work on the canteen weekly, fortnightly, one shift a month or one shift a term. We can fit you in around your work rosters and holidays. Full-day workers have their lunch provided; and we are trialling a new system whereby all full-day volunteers will receive a \$5 voucher for their child to spend at the canteen that day, and morning volunteers will receive a \$2.50 voucher for their child to spend at the canteen that day. If we have more volunteers, we may also be able to open on extra days, so if you would like to help, but could only do a Tuesday or Thursday, please let us know.

The canteen is streamlining their menu to help the volunteers manage in the short term without Fay and Sue; and to help our transition into a Healthy Schools Canteen (which has to be in place by 2019). A new initiative to help the children move towards a healthier canteen is the sale of little fresh fruit snacks for 20c. The children will get a stamp on their card each time they purchase a fruit snack and after 10 stamps, they will get a \$2 credit to spend at the canteen. This initiative will continue for the rest of term 3. We will also not be selling hot food at recess until further notice (after current stock has been used).

In the future, we are hoping our School Parliament can select menus for special 'theme' days at canteen, for example a Pizza Wednesday, or a Sausage on a roll Monday, and children can preorder their lunch for a bit of fun and variety.

# SAFETY around schools

#### ROAD RULES IN SCHOOL ZONES:

#### **Pedestrian crossings**

You cannot stop within 20 metres before a pedestrian crossing or 10 metres after a pedestrian crossing unless there is a control sign permitting parking. Maximum penalty: \$439 and two demerit points

#### **Double parking**

You may not stop on the road alongside to another vehicle at any time even to drop off or pick up passengers. Maximum penalty: \$330 and two demerit points

#### Parking on a verge

You cannot stop or park on a verge area (footpath, nature strip dividing **strip or kerb)**.
